

SURROUNDING POPULATION AND MITIGATION MEASURES

A GOOD NEIGHBOURLY RELATIONS

COMMITTEE will be set up in collaboration with the City of Brossard. A call for candidates will be issued this fall, during which you can apply online. Brossard residents can expect heavier truck traffic on Highway 132 and access roads to the work site. However, no highway traffic restrictions are planned for this fall. La Riveraine bike path will have to be diverted to ensure the safety of pedestrians and cyclists.

For Saint. Lawrence River users, the construction of a temporary jetty will involve putting in place safety measures and a navigation corridor.

Noise and air quality management will be done in accordance with federal government environmental standards and specifications. Evening and night shift teams will take all necessary measures to minimize inconveniences. Mitigation measures are planned and will be communicated at the public information meeting.

REGARDING THE NEW CHAMPLAIN BRIDGE

The New Champlain Bridge Corridor Project is one of the largest infrastructure projects in North America. It also includes a new bridge leading to Nuns' Island, and upgrading of the federal sections of Highway 15 in Montreal and of Highway 10 in Brossard. The project is being carried out as a public-private partnership (P3) between the Government of Canada and Signature on the Saint Lawrence. Works are scheduled to take place over four and a half years.
